 Sustainability - OSM communities are coming up, others that started and are doing so well,... but we have a lot of osm communities still struggling.

How can communities learn from each other?

 Diversity - OpenStreetMap communities are not diverse enough especially geographically and gender representation




Brainstormed the need for documenting knowledge

Webinars to capture more local knowledge




Most repeated themes were prioritized





#### Collaborated in drafting initial chapter based on the prioritized themes



15+ contributors who were already committed to the discussion and webinars <u>helped prioritize</u> the main themes that appeared during the conversations and exercises.

- 1. Identifying local community issues/How mapping can help others work (7 points)
- 2. Attracting and engaging students (5 points)
- 3. Connecting contributors motivation to mapping (4 points)
- 4. Training (4 points)
- Visualize and promote the map outcome/results (3 points)
- 6. Localization (3 points)
- 7. Promote data usage (3 points)

Only 3 out of the 15 volunteers had some free time to help with drafting the playbook.

Engaging the community on the themes they would want to go on the playbook.

From discussions, it is clear that the Community Playbook...


... is from the community to the community and
